There is a lot of excitement in the air as we draw nearer to the long-awaited Lorax production. Whole school rehearsals have been running wonderfully with assistance from Evey's talented mother, Jax, who has choreographed a whole school dance. Simon's organisation and calm approach to rehearsals has also made this journey very enjoyable. It's looking amazing now that our props, audio, sound and backdrops are all in place.

Another exciting school event was **Science Day**. Organised by our talented and creative science teacher, Emmy. The children rotated through 4 groups, each exploring different threatened species. I was lucky enough to run the 'bird wing butterfly group'. This was an opportunity for students to learn how to identify them and learn about their food source and life cycle. The children had the opportunity to propagate the bird wing butterfly vine, make scientific drawings, art and craft.



To support the students our Wellbeing Officer, Billi, has been taking small groups of students out of class on Thursday mornings to participate in friendship games that model positive friendships and how this looks and sounds to encourage children to replicate this in the playground. In class we have used our acting skills to role play scenarios, exploring ways to problem solve and how to react and respond to common social situations.

In class, the Buribi's have been exploring length & position. We have loved using tape measures and rulers to measure everything around us. For the remainder of the term, we are exploring measuring volume and capacity. We'll be using



grams & kilograms as well as half litres and litres, comparing the volume and capacity of different sized and shaped containers, and using hands on learning experiences to discover the differences.

The kids have really loved creating their **spell books** this term and when they come home, next week, they could keep adding recipes, spells and poems to them.





#### Hello all!

In English and History, we will be looking at a song, Hunting for the Worm of the Ocean by Sirroco, as a reference point to learn about past trade links between indigenous people of Arnhem land and the Makasar, people from Indonesia. This will be a useful historical and inter-cultural perspective, different to the context of the First Fleet. It will be part of class discussions and allow us to note what was the same and different between them and their European boating counterparts. We will continue to publish our literary recounts, some narratives, maintain our spelling trajectories and stay on the path with declarative sentences for grammar.

In Maths, we will be looking at measuring lengths using the millimetre, and multiplying double digit numbers by 10, 100, and for some, 1000. We will finish of by exploring different strategies for addition and subtraction. I am enjoying giving students mathematical problems and seeing them come up with solutions that I might not have even suggested myself!



We continue our monumental Lorax endeavours, Trufulla trees all painted up, except for the tree trunk parts. One final push for the final product to be finished! It has truly been an 'all hands on deck' couple of weeks. Please note that because of last week's weather, the Athletics carnival at the Amphitheatre has been moved to this Friday, 20 Sept, 12-2pm.

In mathematics, we continue to dive into the complexities of fractions and division, exploring concepts such as improper fractions, mixed numerals, and their conversions. Our students are also learning about the areas of rectangles and triangles, tackling these fundamental geometric shapes with growing confidence and skill.

Amid all the magazine excitement, we're also preparing for a production of The Lorax. This has required immense effort and concentration from everyone involved, from rehearsals to set design. Recently, our school has had some unexpected and awe-inspiring visitors—dingoes! These beautiful wild animals have occasionally wandered onto the school grounds, and we've taken this opportunity to educate ourselves on how to respond safely and respectfully to their presence.

Here's what we've learned about handling dingo encounters:

- **Be big and brave** Make yourself appear large and dominant.
- Face the dingo—Never turn your back Keep your arms close to your body and, if with someone, stand back-to-back.
- Shout at it Be loud and confident. Shouting 'dingo!' will alert others in the area to assist. Roaring is more effective than screaming.
- If you need to back away, do it calmly and slowly. If there is no space, stand your ground and keep calling for help.
- **Tell a teacher** Always report the encounter to an adult for further action.



While these guidelines are good, most encounters have been resolved with short, careful chases to encourage the dingoes to leave. It's been an unexpected but valuable learning experience for us all.
