






Hi families,

We have all been very happy to return to circus this last week, and excited to know we'll get some extra catch up days in the next fortnight.

This last fortnight the kids have been concentrating on using their knowledge of **separating 100s, 10s and 1s to add larger numbers** using various addition strategies. They have been working at their level and all showing a growing mathematical understanding and really getting into it.















We have started **designing our dream homes** and getting ready in investigations to build a model out of cardboard and other materials.

The Year 1's and I enjoyed having Buribi for their first **transition** visit. We designed and made clay robots, while the Year 2's excitedly told me about the drama activities they did with Ruben in the Yuruugin class.

I hope you all enjoyed receiving the **beautiful clay bells** the kids have made. There will be others available for sale at the Fete.

In English, students have chosen celebrations to dive into deeper to research and present. They are reading texts and collecting images. The images will be linked to the original texts, then unpacked to inform their writing along with brainstorming their growing knowledge.

Also, as a new fun thing, we have been solving 9 letter 'target' style puzzles during spelling routines. We have been having fun decoding words from the phonemes and clues, which helps us identify the likely graphemes, or 'spellings', as a class and in small groups. The extra clue help has made it very accessible to us all.

In Maths we continue with multiplicative thinking. Year 3 are using arrays to figure out division problems and Year 4 are working on simple long division problems.

In Art, we are just starting the marbling for the fete this week. Students are excited to get going with paper and fabric marbling with all materials now onsite.

Boy's Group.

One of my favourite parts of the week is the lunchtime Boys Group. Usually, it's all kept confidential, but this week, I asked the boys if they're okay to share some of it. In Term 2, we chose and prioritised a collection of talking points and set to work examining the topics. We've covered a lot of important issues and this week's was a big one; Mental Health.

We looked at what indicators we might see to let us know that we may need support or strategies for managing our mental health. The boys came up with the following list of indicators: other people's perspectives that we trust, not sleeping, being distracted, crying, getting angry or annoyed, not coping, being forgetful and not thinking logically. We thought about what, who or where we could get help and support if we need it. The boys came up with: the various social services, our parents, a counsellor or therapist, and things like RUOK.

We considered what strategies we could use in managing our mental health. The boys came up with: breathing, comfort food, sleeping, sports and exercise, mindfulness and just talking about it.

They do this every week; I ask a few leading questions, and they come up with amazing wisdom and insight every time. Their maturity and depth of thinking impress me every time and gives me great hope for their future.

Fete Preparations

Leading up to the Fete, we have been compiling our Guruman Anthology of Poetry, which is proving to be an amazing publication, available for sale at the Fete. It's a great read.

We have also been putting our macrame skills to good use in creating a collection of pot plant holders to hold beautiful flowerpots. These will also be available for purchase at the Fete.

Fete Performances

Marimbas, violins, guitar, piano, harmonicas, trumpet and violins will all be included in the musical performances presented at the Fete, with a couple of songs as a collaboration with the Yuruugin musicians. It is sounding amazing.

Graduation preparations.

Leading up to the big day at the end of the year when we celebrate our year 6s graduation, the students are preparing their speeches and performances. We are starting early so it should be an impressive presentation.
